CHAIR'S WELCOME BY DR. SUSAN O'MALLEY

Welcome to the NGO CSW 61 Forum

NGO CSW/NY is pleased that women from around the globe are meeting together for the two weeks of CSW61 in the face of obstacles caused by the growing nationalism in the world. If women have been denied visas, it is important that they are included in our parallel events by Skype or phone or written remarks. At CSW61 women and men need to strategize together to build the feminist/women's movement to ensure the human rights of all women, to learn best practices from each other, and to work to implement the Sustainable Development Goals in our countries.

The word "empowerment" as used in the Priority Theme, "The Economic Empowerment of Women in the Changing World of Work", raises questions. The Oxford English Dictionary defines "empower" as "to invest legally or formally with power" or "to permit", in other words, as a person in power allowing an individual woman to achieve a gain without a sense of women collectively. Too often "leave no one behind" is forgotten in discussions of empowerment when a woman is praised for breaking a previous economic barrier. We need to see the Priority Theme in term of human rights, a concept that works better horizontally than vertically.

We also must remember our work is grounded in human rights: the International Declaration of Human Rights (IDHR, 1948), the Convention for the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW, 1979) and The Beijing Platform for Action (BPfA, 1995). The IDHR, article 23.2., states, "Everyone, without any discrimination, has the right to equal pay for equal work." CEDAW, 1979, Article 11, affirms, "States Parties shall take all appropriate measures to eliminate discrimination against women in the field of employment in order to ensure, on a basis of equality of men and women, the same rights." And the BPfA IV.F.165, states, "Enact and enforce legislation to guarantee the rights of women and men to equal work or work of equal value." In other words, what is important for our work at CSW61 is insisting on the implementation of our rights, not simply restating them.

In the international environment of the curtailing of space for NGOs, we also need to take advantage of every opportunity given to civil society at CSW 61 to make our voices heard whether in oral interventions in the UN or working, when possible, with our national delegations to implement the SDGs in our countries, particularly SDG 5 on gender equality. We need to organize at our Caucus meetings or at the UN Women's event on "Building the Feminist/Women's Movement" on March 17 at Cooper Union.

Women may also find it productive to work at the local level by either working to pass the human rights framework of CEDAW in their towns or cities as has been done in 17 U.S. cities. Or in the majority of countries that have passed CEDAW to use it to ensure women's human rights as is being done increasingly to protect the rights of women refugees (gen. rec. 32) and migrants (gen. rec. 26).

During CSW 61 we need to gird ourselves with our human rights documents and organize together to strengthen the feminist movement and implement our economic rights in the changing world of work. Remember that gender equality is the best indicator of peace in a nation.

Have a productive and energizing two weeks at CSW 61.

NGO CSW 61 FORUM INTRODUCTION

The review theme reminds us of the connection between violence against women and the gender inequalities in the workplace.



United NATIONS INSTRUMENTS

Summary

At the Fourth World Conference on Women in Beijing, Hillary Rodham Clinton noted that "Human Rights are Women's Rights and Women's Rights are Human Rights." Why is it that we've yet to achieve recognition of this fact? Whether it's the horrific statistic that 1 out of every 3 women will be victims of violence at some point in her life, or that women are more prone to poverty and the associated problems of hunger, health issues and adequate shelter, or the question of whether or not women can achieve their full potential to contribute to society and the well-being of their families—it is obvious that we have a long way to go.

Against this backdrop, the international community ratified and enacted many laws or conventions to protect women and achieve full human rights. From the standpoint of the United Nations, here are a few that are critical to advancing the women's agenda.

Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW)

CEDAW was adopted in 1979 by the UN General Assembly and has been ratified by 187 countries (out of 193). Member states that have not ratified are: United States, Iran, Somalia, Sudan, two Pacific Island nations (Palau and Tonga). CEDAW is often described as an international bill of rights for women and defines what constitutes discrimination against women and sets up an agenda for national action to end such discrimination.

The Convention defines discrimination against women as "...any distinction, exclusion or restriction made on the basis of sex which has the effect or purpose of impairing or nullifying the recognition, enjoyment or exercise by women, irrespective of their marital status, on a basis of equality of men and women, of human rights and fundamental freedoms in the political, economic, social, cultural, civil or any other field." By ratifying the Convention, each country commits to undertake a series of measures to end discrimination against women in all forms.

Beijing Declaration

Adopted at the Fourth World Conference on Women 4-15 September, 1995 (50 years after the founding of the UN), the Declaration states, "We are convinced that: Women's empowerment and their full participation on the basis of equality in all spheres of society, including participation in the decision-making process and access to power, are fundamental for the achievement of equality, development and peace". This statement and the rest of the Declaration goes on to acknowledge that women's empowerment and full participation is critical to "We the Peoples" achieving the vision and promise of the United Nations.

Beijing Platform for Action (BPfA)

Also adopted as a result of the Fourth World Conference on Women is the Beijing Platform for Action (BPfA). The Mission Statement clearly identifies that, "The Platform for Action is an agenda for women's empowerment". It specifies twelve critical areas of concern: poverty, education and training, health, violence, armed conflict, economy, empowerment and decision-making, institutional mechanism for advancement, human rights, media, environment and, for the first time, includes specific needs of the girl-child.

UN Security Resolution 1325

The Security Council adopted resolution (S/RES/1325) on women and peace and security on 31 October 2000. The resolution reaffirms the important role of women in the prevention and resolution of conflicts, peace negotiations, peace-building, peacekeeping, humanitarian response and post-conflict reconstruction. This resolution also stresses the importance of women's equal participation and full involvement in all efforts for the maintenance and promotion of peace and security. Resolution 1325 urges all actors to increase the participation of women and incorporate gender perspectives in all United Nations peace and security efforts. It also calls on all parties in conflict to take special measures to protect women and girls from gender-based violence, particularly rape and other forms of sexual abuse, in situations of armed conflict. The resolution provides a number of important operational mandates, with implications for Member States and the entities of the United Nations system.

2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

17 GOALS TO TRANSFORM OUR WORLD

In September 2015, at a historical United Nations Summit, the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) were adopted by world leaders as a mechanism to focus world attention. Over the next fifteen years the SDGs are to be implemented by the 193 United Nations Member States (countries). SDGs are designed to end all forms of poverty and inequalities and tackle climate change. No one is to be left behind.

All countries, poor, rich and middle-income have been called to enact the United Nations SDGs by promoting prosperity and protecting the planet. Although the SDGs are not legally binding, governments are expected to take ownership, establish national frameworks to achieve the 17 Goals and report at least once on what they have accomplished at the High Level Political Forum (HLPF) held every July at the UN.

Follow up and review of progress are the primary responsibilities of countries in implementing the 17 SDGs with 169 targets. Identified targets will help operationalize and manage measures of success/ failure in achieving SDGs through quality indicators and accessible, timely data collection. Regional and global reviews will contribute to follow up. Follow the SDGs at sustainabledevelopment.un.org.

World Conferences on Women

The Committee on the Status of Women helped to organize four world conferences on women. These conferences have sought to unite the international community behind a set of common objectives with an effective plan of action for the advancement of women everywhere, in all spheres of public and private life. The first three conferences set the groundwork for the seminal fourth conference held in Beijing in 1995.

The outcome of the first conference held in Mexico City in 1975, with 133 Member States, was the adoption of the First World Plan for Action which called upon governments to develop strategies that would bring gender equality, eliminate gender discrimination and integrate women in development and peace-building. Within the United Nations, the Plan of Action also led to the establishment of INSTRAW (International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women) and UNIFEM (United Nations Fund for Women).

The Second World Conference, held in Copenhagen in1980, brought together 145 Members States to review the Mexico Plan for Action and stated that despite the progress made, special actions needed to be taken in areas such as employment opportunities, adequate health care services and education.

At the Third World Conference held in Nairobi in 1985, the UN told the attending 157 Member States that only a small minority of women had benefited from the improvements to the status of women. Participants were asked to find new strategies to ensure that peace, development and equality could be achieved. Three concerns identified in Nairobi include equality in social participation, equality in political participation and decision-making. The conference further recognized the necessity of women to participate in discussions in all areas and not only on gender equality.

The Fourth World Conference on Women in Beijing (1995) was the largest conference the United Nations had ever organized. Some 189 governments, including government delegates, representatives of NGOs, journalists and all the United Nations organizations attended the Conference.

The 189 UN Member States adopted unanimously the Beijing Platform for Action (BPFA) to ensure the improvement of all women without any exceptions. The BPFA outlined 12 critical issues, which constitute barriers for the advancement of women, and identified a range of

actions that governments, the United Nations and civil society groups should take to make women's human rights a reality.

The twelve critical concerns identified in the BPfA include: poverty of women, unequal access to education, lack and unequal access to health care systems, violence against women, vulnerabilities of women in armed conflict, inequality in economic structures, inequalities in power and decision-making, institutional mechanisms to improve the advancement of women, lack of respects and inadequate protection in human rights, under-representation of women in the media, inequalities in natural resource management and in the safeguarding of the environment, and the discrimination and violation of the girl child.

The full implementation of the twelve issues would enhance empowerment of women economically, socially and politically. The CSW Commission has systematically reviewed progress in the implementation of the twelve critical areas of concern identified in the BPfA at its annual sessions, and has adopted action-oriented recommendations, in the form of agreed conclusions, to facilitate increased implementation at all levels.

Commission on the Status of Women (CSW)

CSW is a function of the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). A global policy-making body, it is exclusively dedicated to promoting gender equality and the empowerment of women. Established in 1946, its mandate is to prepare recommendations on promoting women's rights in the political, economic, civil, social and educational fields. The Commission also makes recommendations to the Council on urgent problems requiring immediate attention in the field of women's rights.

The Bureau of the Commission plays a crucial role in facilitating the preparation for, and in ensuring the successful outcome of, the annual sessions of the Commission. The Bureau for the 61st session (2017) comprises the following members:

United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN Women)

The General Assembly created UN Women in 2010 to accelerate gender equality and empowerment of women. As part of the UN reform agenda, resources and mandates were consolidated into one organization for greater impact. The main roles of UN Women are:

- To support inter-governmental bodies, such as the Commission on the Status of Women, in its formulation of policies, global standards and norms;
- To help Member States to implement these standards, standing ready to provide suitable technical and financial support to those countries that request it, and to forge effective partnerships with civil society;
- To lead and coordinate the UN system's work on gender equality as well as promote accountability, including regular monitoring of system-wide progress.

Under-Secretary-General Phumzile Mlambo-Ngcuka is the Executive Director of UN Women. She and her team work collaboratively with Member States, non governmental organizations (NGOs), other UN agencies, academia and the private sector to advance the following priority areas:

- Increasing women's leadership and participation;
- Ending violence against women and girls;
- Engaging women in all aspects of peace and security processes;
- Enhancing women's economic empowerment; and
- Making gender equality central to national development planning and budgeting.

The NGO Committee on the Status of Women, NY (NGO CSW/NY)

NGO CSW/NY supports the work of the UN Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) and UN Women in advancing gender equality and empowerment of women and girls. NGO CSW/NY is an untiring advocate with Member States for gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls across the globe in support of the work of the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women and UN Women. NGO CSW/NY supports the implementation of the 1995 Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, UN Security Resolution 1325, the UN Millennium Development Goals, the Convention to Eliminate All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

NGO CSW/NY represents hundreds of member organizations and individuals concerned about the status of women and girls. Events at the UN headquarters in New York are monitored on a daily basis with daily participation.

Every year in New York City, NGO CSW/NY organizes NGO Consultation Day in preparation for the session on the UN Commission on the Status of Women that takes place in March for two weeks. Activists gather from around the world to discuss issues pertaining to women and girls, to network, share strategies/best practices and to lobby governments to implement resolutions and treaties that they have signed. NGO Representatives are brought together to caucus, issue joint statements and provide wording for the Agreed Conclusions of the annual United Nations Commission on the Status of Women.

NGO CSW/NY participates at CSW meetings by conducting trainings and orientation for NGO representatives and, through its vast network, keeps women worldwide apprised of gender-based issues, throughout the year. Our monthly meetings feature UN and government speakers and, most importantly, we promote "women's rights are human rights" at the UN and other international meetings.

THE NEXT CHAPTER by Phumzile Mlambo-Nacuka

The gathering of civil society during the 61st Commission on the Status of Women provides a critical opportunity to align and strengthen messaging, and to join together in solidarity for all women and girls in the face of rising global challenges.

We are living in a world driven apart by inequality, insecurity, conflict, violence, and a staggering migrant and refugee crisis. Around the world we are witnessing the spread of intolerance, fear and exclusion, and a response that weakens notions of the common good and human solidarity. We are seeing an instrumentalization of economic inequality, sometimes giving rise to a rhetoric of intolerance and rejection of pluralism and diversity. These dynamics have a profound impact on the promotion of women's rights and the achievement of gender equality. This is a critical time to promote economic justice, sexual and reproductive rights, affordable healthcare, protection for asylum-seekers, migrants and minorities, environmental and climate justice, and international cooperation. Global solidarity is essential to energize civil society activism, protect and expand spaces for public participation and increase funding for civil society and gender equality work. Wherever there are injustices, exclusion, and barriers to women thriving, we have a voice and we can amplify and connect the voices of others. Whatever happens, anywhere in the world, if it chips away at progress, we must respond and continue to promote our shared goals of peace, gender equality, human rights, sustainability and shared prosperity, especially for the most marginalized and excluded.

Equality and inclusion are at the heart of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its promise to leave no one behind. This means reaching out to the most marginalized women and girls, and those experiencing multiple and intersecting forms of discrimination. Civil society plays a critical role in addressing the unique needs of these women and girls and capitalizing on their strengths and agency as we move to substantive equality, a Planet 50-50 by 2030.

The holistic vision of the 2030 Agenda also provides inspiration and possibilities for revitalizing partnerships and alliances. It is essential for the feminist movement to continue its efforts to further increase the

diversity and the number of people working on the achievement of gender equality. We need to continue our efforts to bring in individuals and groups – such as men and boys, young people and faith-based organizations – to support our agenda.

This session of the Commission on the Status of Women with its priority theme on women's economic empowerment in the changing world of work is an important opportunity to strengthen policy recommendations for a defining issue of the gender equality agenda. The rapid changes witnessed in the economy, and in particular in the world of work, present both challenges and opportunities for women. The Commission is a chance to take stock of these changes and make sure that women are well positioned to benefit from them. This will require commitment and deliberate actions from Governments, business, civil society and other partners, and the Commission's deliberations can play a key role in charting the way forward.

As we gather here at CSW 61, let us use this moment to speak with one voice and share solidarity for feminist movement-building to create a better world for women and girls.




