Women Thrive compiles results from the scorecards, analyzes the data to reveal trends and identify gaps.

THE PROCESS

Equipped with the data, we and our Alliance members hold national governments accountable to developing implementation strategies that are inclusive, participatory, and citizen-led.

SUMMARY

150 organizations in 30 countries filled out the scorecard. This report is a collation of their responses, both Anglophone and Francophone. The key conclusions are that:

Members are knowledgeable + have access to information. ...but they are lacking resources (\$\$) for advocacy activities around the SDGs

"As much as the government is actively involved [in SDG planning], not much awareness has been done at the grassroots levels. My organization is therefore working hard to raise awareness at the grassroots. "Only CSOs organize meetings to discuss issues regarding SDGs...women in my country are still considered minority and inferior...men misunderstand the whole aspect of gender equality. women promoting SDG5 are seen as enemies or a threat to society."

"Our state-to-state advocacy and training is tied to the negligence of grassroots women/girls by the government and we hope to partner with the stategovernments to reach out to more women/girls."

GIVEN THESE RESULTS, WOMEN THRIVE ALLIANCE URGES:



MORE FUNDING FOR GRASSROOTS ADVOCACY AROUND SDG IMPLEMENTATION

While Alliance members are well informed, educated, and proactive in retrieving information about the SDG framework; while they are already advocating around SDG5 as the vehicle through which to implement gender equality policies in their countries...their seemingly biggest hurdle is funding for advocacy. 90% have not secured SDG5 advocacy funding, and 79% do not know where to find such funds

Thus, we urge that FEWER efforts are made to inform and communicate ABOUT the SDGs (as that is clearly working) and MORE efforts are put toward supporting and financing grassroots advocacy around the SDGs, especially SDG5, implementation.



INCREASED ADVOCACY AROUND CIVIL SOCIETY PARTICIPATION IN SDG IMPLEMENTATION PROCESSES AT NATIONAL LEVEL

Globally, Alliance members are consistently left outside of decision-making spaces. The majority of respondents know which gov't agencies are responsible for implementing the SDG framework and they have reached out respectively to get involved...yet they are still not included. As prominent civil society organizations with links to women and girls in both urban and rural communities, they are resources for gov't as they plan the implementation of the SDG framework

As such, we urge governments to respond to and engage grassroots gender equality organizations in their events and meetings for planning SDG implementation, especially SDG5, to ensure grassroots women and girls needs are heard and heeded.
