Women and Peace Agreements Database

This database comprises part of PA-X, a peace agreement database which is intended to operate as a **Peace Agreement Access Tool**. This database will give access to a definitive collection of peace agreements from 1990 to present day, which at present comprise around 1200 peace agreements in around 100 jurisdictions. Its purpose is to enable research on peace agreement provisions, and to support those engaging in peace processes to access comparative information on how peace agreements deal with core issues of inclusion, human rights, and development. The full database is scheduled for publication at the start of 2017. The current database is a sub-database of all the agreements which include an explicit reference to women and gender, with searchable sub-categories.

View all: you can either search, leaving all the boxes below on 'include all', or press the 'view a listing' button at the bottom of the page.

Search boxes: enable you to select agreements by country/entity, agreement/conflict type, and agreement stage, and to select particular 'provisions' included in the peace agreement, from pull-down boxes (up to 7 issues), in any combination. If you do not chose a sub-category, the entire entry for women will be shown. The results page also includes a link to the agreement text. All search results can be viewed as a PDF, or exported to excel for quantitative analysis. Please note the exports take some time, but will download if you wait.
