The Program Director of the Gaston Z. Ortigas Peace Institute on Peace Education and Capability Building. She has assisted the Institute's peace partners all over the country in enhancing capacities to transform conflicts and build peace. She has documented two cases of peaceful resolution of conflicts and co-authored a publication titled, "GZOPPI Model on Peaceful Approaches to Conflict." Josephine is part of the second cohort of N-Peace trainers.

Please join us for an exciting dialogue on promoting the leadership role of women in peace and security. The discussion will focus on highlights and lessons from a multi-country initiative called N-Peace which works across Afghanistan, Sri Lanka, Timor-Leste, Indonesia, Nepal and the Philippines. N-Peace uses a networking approach to connect peace practitioners for a common advocacy agenda on promoting peace with and for women. Using innovative means for outreach and awareness raising, the project runs the N-Peace Awards campaign which to date has engaged over 150,000 people from across the region in support of Women, Peace and Security issues.

UNDP and the Institute for Inclusive Security have collaborated through the N-Peace initiative with support from AusAID to create a strong community of practice from their capacity development efforts, leading to enhanced individual capacities as well as a stronger advocacy agenda on WPS across the network countries and region more broadly. Practitioners trained through this initiative are having a multiplier effect beyond the important work of training others. Some of them are leading their own collective advocacy efforts and have the potential to further mobilize coalitions for sustained advocacy.
